

FROM PRISON SENTENCE TO Y. M. C. A. SECRETARY Seoul, Korea, May 22.—Yun Chibo, once sentenced to prison as the leader of the alleged conspiracy against the life of count Terachi, governor general, has been appointed general secretary of the Young Men's Christian Association of Korea, succeeding J. M. Brockman, who has become honorary general secretary.

While a leader in Christian missionary work, Yun Chibo and five others were convicted of the famous conspiracy and sent to prison for a six year term. Yun Chibo was pardoned last year at the request of count Terachi, who believed that the plot was due not to private motives but to a mistaken belief by the Koreans that they were acting in their country's interests.
