PEACE COMING, GERARD SAYS

American Ambassador Declares U. S. is Ready To Undertake Mediation.

Berlin, Germany, May 28.—United States ambassador Jas. W. Gerard is convinced that peace is in sight, according to an interview published in a Munich paper from its Berlin correspondent. Mr. Gerard is quoted as saying: "Nothing can shake my confidence that peace is on its way."

The ambassador referred to the settlement of the differences of the United States and Germany as preparing the way. "President Wilson," he said, "has much greater freedom of action now to deal with the immense world problem which will determine the future attitude of nearly all the countries of the globe."

Chancellor's Words Echoed in U. S. "I am very optimistic regarding the progress already made of the idea that war should be ended, even among belligerent nations."

Referring to the recent crisis in German-American relations the ambassador said: "I hardly know from what quarter the present good relations between the United States and Germany could be disturbed. The establishment of good relations with Germany is one of the most important factors of the diplomatic situation now confronting the United States."

French Woman, Member Of Legion Of Honor, Highly Revered, Dies

Paris, France, May 27.—Madame Jane Dieulafoy, author, explorer, chevalier of the Legion of Honor, and possessor of the unique privilege accorded by the French government of wearing male apparel, is dead.

Mme. Dieulafoy was not yet out of her teens when she married Marcel Auguste Dieulafoy, a young engineer. He went to the front during the Franco-Prussian war and took his bride with him.

In the eighties M. Dieulafoy was commanded to go to Asia for archaeological research. Madame Dieulafoy accompanied him and spent several years in Chaldea and Persia. They discovered the ruins of the palaces of Darius and Artaxerxes.

Charged with kidnaping four young girls on April 24 and holding them in Juarez for 24 hours, Maria Soledad and Louisa Hernandez, two Mexican women, were arrested Friday afternoon by city detectives, Harold and county probation officer Emma Webster.

It is alleged that the women lured the girls, Valentina Silva, Blanca Villegas, Josefina Villa and Esther Monis, from the Aoy school to Juarez on promise of getting them some clothes and held them there for 24 hours. The girls range in age from 14 to 15 years.

Mrs. Webster was informed of the case at once and has been at work for over a month. The women remained in Juarez, however, and no arrest could be made until Friday afternoon when they were taken in custody at the bridge.

GALLIEN, DEFENDER OF PARIS, DIES

Dramatic Military Career Full of Perils, Ends in Death of Disease.

Paris, France, May 27.—Gen. Jos Gallien, former minister of war, died at Versailles today.

The death of Gen. Gallien, while not unexpected, created profound sorrow as he was idolized by the French people, particularly the poor who regarded him as the savior of Paris during the critical days of August, 1914. His funeral will be the occasion of a notable military and civil demonstration.

Shortly before his death an operation for transfusion of blood was performed but it had little effect. The general was extremely weak and was unable to take nourishment. He and daughter were at his bedside.

Born of Military Family. Of all the French generals in the European war few had a better filled life than Gen. Gallien, who, on the outbreak of the great war in August, 1914, was appointed military governor of the entrenched camp of Paris. Born of a military family at St. Beat April 24, 1834, he had reached the age limit for retirement in 1912, but was maintained in active service by decree. The minister of war holding that he was a victor he had rendered as governor general of Madagascar justified an exception generally made only in favor of generals who have held supreme command in the face of the enemy.

In the 45 years of his military career, Gallien had participated in some of the dramatic episodes of the war of 1870, explored the Upper Niger and proposed a French protectorate over the region; pacified the colony of Indo-China, deposed queen Rannavaloa of Madagascar and conquered and developed the colony. Between times he had written four notable books on exploration.

His Baptism of Fire. Two years after his graduation from the academy at Saint-Cyr in 1856, Gallien received his baptism of fire as a second lieutenant of marine infantry at Bazellea. He was at the side of commandant Lambert who with a handful of men opposed a heroic resistance to the Bavarians at the house

called "Les Dernieres Cartouches"—The Last Cartridges—after the famous fighting of the scene by Alphonse de Neuville. Named lieutenant after the war, Gallien was first garrisoned at the Penitence. Promoted captain in 1873, he was sent to the banks of the Niger in 1879 and was charged in 1880 with the mission of reestablishing relations with Ahmadou, sultan of Segou.

Negotiated Despite Death Threats. Though fiercely attacked by the Barbakas, Capt. Gallien pursued his march and reached Segou to become a captive for eight months. Every morning of that captivity he received notice from the sultan that he and his companions were to be decapitated. Unmoved by this constant menace, he carried his negotiations with the sultan and instead of losing his head finished by securing from the sultan the grant in France, the ceding of all other nations, of the commerce of the Upper Niger.

The Defence of Paris. On August 27, 1914, with the Germans threatening Paris, he was given the important post of commander of the entrenched camp and military governor of Paris. The question of declaring Paris an open town was seriously discussed at that time. The departure of the government for Bordeaux created a great deal of uneasiness and all those who were in the capital at the time recall the feeling of relief and revival of confidence following the posting of Gallien's proclamation in which he declared: "I have received the mission of defending Paris against the invader. I will accomplish that mission to the end."

Aid in Battle of the Marne. At once his organizing ability and energy were shown. In a few days the city was surrounded by new field fortifications. Heavy artillery was posted at all vantage points, a complete system of telephonic and telegraphic communication was established around the city. The part he played in the battle of the Marne is partly known; how on a Sunday, when the German lightning like advance was progressing, he sent 50,770 men of the troops of the army of Paris, in taxi motor cars, across the town, but to the spot where Gen. Xauouroy was assembling his army and brought his forces up to a strength that enabled him to fall upon von Kluck's flank protection and start the great victory of the Marne.

Work as War Minister. An war minister, Gen. Gallien devoted himself with remarkable energy to the elimination of red tape in the administration of the army. He also dealt with a heavy hand with officers who had secured posts through favoritism or political influence. His fiercest work was to force civilians to write to the generals in the field in regard to military matters and his next was to send to the front a number of able bodied soldiers, who were occupying billets in the rear. Like Gen. Joffre he was relentless in forcing the retirement of old officers whose activities or abilities were not equal to the demands of the war. By revision of the exempt lists he added 30,000 men to the army.
