Cheese Souffle By CONSTANCE CLARKE. THIS cheese souffle is delicious, and the recipe is easily prepared. Take half a cup of fine flour, half a cup of butter, three raw yolks of eggs, a pinch of pepper, a saltspoonful of salt, and mix these with one pint of cold milk, stir over the fire till it boils, then add two more tablespoonfuls of cold milk, six ounces of grated parmesan cheese and five whites of eggs, whipped stiff, with a pinch of salt. Butter a souffle dish and fix around it a band of buttered paper so as to stand two or three inches above the edge of the dish; pour in the above souffle mixture, sprinkle the top with a few browned bread crumbs, put a few little pieces of butter here and there on the top to keep it moist, and bake in a moderate oven for three-quarters of an hour. When cooked, remove the paper and serve at once; a little grated cheese may be sprinkled on the top, if liked. This is a good dish for luncheon, or for a second course or savory at dinner; it can also be cooked in little fancy cases.

How To Bathe

I CAN ALMOST hear protests from will not keep her skin clear, she readers as soon as they have finished that line "How to Bathe." Of course they know how to bathe, they say—and so they do, but there are

several ways of taking baths, and I am only going to tell of one of the best.

Now, having decided to go over herself thoroughly, giving herself a beauty housecleaning, so to speak, the woman must pay special attention to this item of bathing. Merely washing face and hands thoroughly

will not keep her skin clear, she must cleanse her body all over once each day, at least.

The most ordinary sort of bath is the "warm" one. For this, the water is between 90 and 98 degrees Fahrenheit. It is the best sort, really, for cold baths and very hot baths both draw strength from the body.

Draw the tub fairly full of water. Step in, rubbing the body all over with the lather of a good bath soap. Rub the hands over the skin, working the lather into the pores. Rinse off thoroughly, with a sponge if you like. The soda neutralizes and cut the oils on the skin, the warm water opens the pores, the warmth draws fresh blood to the skin, and relaxes the tensed muscles.

Rub with a large, fairly rough towel—Turkish towels are best. You can finish the bath with a cold shower with good results—unless you have been feeling tired; but this is a matter of custom and convenience. Never dress till the skin is quite dry—and, if possible, lie down a few moments after bathing. The continued relaxing of the muscles will start you off again feeling like a new soul.

So, clean inside and out, you can turn your attention to other little details of the toilette that make for permanent beauty.

Reply—You can have a tooth made to match the shade of your other teeth, costing less than a gold tooth. You can have enamel teeth put in where the gold ones are, improving the appearance of your mouth.
