FINANCIAL... BE SENT MEXICO... Note To Carranza Thanks Him For Courteous Reply To Recent Messages.

U. S. RESERVISTS ARE CALLED OUT! Militiamen With Dependent Families Are To Be Discharged On Request.

WASHINGTON, D. C., July 7.—A note formally accepting Gen. Carranza's proposal that differences between the United States and the de facto government of Mexico be settled by direct negotiations was handed today to Eliseo Arredondo, the Mexican ambassador designate.

Text of American Note... The text of the note, addressed to Mr. Arredondo, follows: "Sir, I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your communication of July 4, 1916, in which you transcribe a note addressed to me by the secretary of the foreign government of your government and to request that you will transmit to him the following reply:

U. S. Ready To Negotiate... It is especially pleasing to my government that the de facto government of Mexico is disposed to give quick and practical consideration, in a spirit of concord, to the remedies which may be applied to the existing conditions. Reciprocating the same desire, the government of the United States is prepared immediately to exchange views on the matter in the most friendly and prevent a recurrence of the difficulties which have been the source of the controversy.

CONNECTICUT CAVALRY TROOP REACHES NOGALES...
