LANDS OF RICHARDSON CONSTRUCTION CO. DEVASTATED; PEOPLE ARE STARVING

Outpost Duty, Night Attacks, Digging in, Bridge Building Planned.

A set of maneuvers have been formed for the militiamen encamped near El Paso and general preparations are being completed for starting within two weeks the biggest war game ever undertaken in this country in times of peace.

Special rest will be added to these maneuvers because they are held in the border country. The work includes several night alarms and calls to regular attacks.

Two Weeks to Get Settled. The guardsmen will probably be given two weeks in which to drill, polish up camps and properly acclimate themselves.

After that rifle ranges will be formed at the foot of Mt. Franklin and every infantry regiment of militia will be required to organize a machine gun company and will be furnished with machine guns already on the way to El Paso.

Battle Practice. After thorough reorganization of every brigade, the real practice will then begin, as outlined in the program given out.

Advance through zone of infantry fire. Advance through zone of infantry fire before fire superiority has been developed and selection of various defensive positions with actual construction of trenches, if possible; defensive work; clearing of foreground, sighting and constructing obstacles; range marks, assignment of sectors for distribution of fire, actual development of position including a counter attack; service of security outposts by day, including selection of outguard positions, training of sentinels in observation, defensive arrangements of trenches, obstacles, lines of retreat, patrolling.

Outpost Duty. Outpost duty will then be taken up, with each company performing its normal functions. Various positions to be occupied and compared; positions occupied at night with frequent patrols; night competent instruction. This will be followed by advance guard work, particular attention being paid to rapid development of immediate attack on small localities, with skeleton troops remaining; advance guard work, with particular attention to action of reserve company moving to assistance of outposts; occupation of important positions to flanks as well as to front; rear guard work, deployment on action; cooperation of artillery and execution of cavalry; outpost duty (late afternoon and night) to emphasize action when adjacent support has been driven back and own support is subject to heavy attack; also occupation (at night) of a position which has not been reconnoitered previously.

Brigade will then be practiced by the troops.

Pennington Guard To Keep Cool; Receive \$500 Worth of Ice Each Month

Pennington national guardsmen will keep cool for the remainder of the summer. The friends of the Pennington regiments now in camp on the border here have made up an ice fund of \$500 a month and will keep the regiments supplied with ice throughout the summer.

The order for the ice has been made with a local ice company and the first shipment will be delivered daily to the Pennington camps.

Jersey Surgeon, Born in Indian Days, Comes Back

Douglas, Ariz., July 10.—Major surgeon H. D. Corbuser of the New Jersey forces just established here, has come back to the land of his birth. He was born at the farm of his father, James Corbuser, in central Arizona, where his father was surgeon and his mother the only white woman in the territory being taken to Fort Grant and Fort Apache. His father, Dr. Wm. H. Corbuser, was appointed to the army from California in 1846 and was with the expedition into China and in the Philippines, though latterly in private practice in Philadelphia, N. J.
