

SO. CAROLINA MEN ENTERTAIN

Officers of Second Infantry Give Entertainment at Camp Thursday Night.

South Carolina officers of the second infantry, South Carolina national guard, gave El Pasoans and the newspaper men in the army camps a demonstration of genuine South Carolina hospitality Thursday night at the headquarters' mess hall of the regiment near Tobin.

The affair was arranged by Col. Thomas B. Springs, commander of the regiment, assisted by W. F. Caldwell, of the Columbia, S. C., News and Courier, and a committee of officers. The guest of honor was Gen. George Bell, Jr., who arrived in his automobile soon after the program started and was cheered.

The South Carolina quartet sang southern songs, including an original one, "Carolina," which was composed by the guests. Sgt. Maj. J. Doyle, of Georgetown, S. C., which is Col. Springs' home, made the hit of the entertainment when he sang and played his own accompaniment upon a guitar. He yodeled, sang "Down in the City of Boogie" and gave a demonstration of his ability to hold a high note for more than a minute.

31ST MICHIGAN MAKES GOOD RECORD IN ITS MANEUVERS

Reports made by the war department on Friday of the maneuvering in the field done by the 31st Michigan infantry during the past month indicate that had the campaign been made in real war, the Detroit regiment would probably have won a star. The greatly winning most of its engagements. The war department grades compared the work with what would have been done by well trained units. The grades found most frequently in the report was in the 30s. There was but one grade below 30, which was 41 percent. There were several 90s and a single 100.

The best job of fighting was done by company D, commanded by Capt. Alma Lake, in the company of the 31st Michigan infantry who did the best in other tests were. Company I, Capt. Albert C. Wilson, and company B, Lieut. Joseph Backus, in signifying company L, Capt. Richard Smith, and company M, Capt. David B. Phillips, in first aid demonstration, and company H, Capt. Fred W. Beaudry, in field equipment.

The regiment was better in combat than in anything else, and poorest in first aid. The 100 score was won by Capt. Milton L. Hinkley in estimating distances.


