Removing Birthmarks

DO YOU REMEMBER the days when you read fairy tales, and the beautiful princess was always identified by a strawberry mark on her left

So many people think that birthmarks are incurable, and suffer agonies year after year, that it seems incredible. I knew a woman who stayed home almost all the time, and never stirred out until dark, and then wore a veil to hide the marks, until, losing the blessing of the sun and the reviving tonic of the winds, she became almost insanely morbid. One day she became violently ill and was rushed to a hospital, where a young doctor undertook to cure her markings by electricity. He succeeded, and the woman went home feeling ten or twenty years younger in mind and body.

Tattoo marks may be removed by tattooing the same places over again with a solution known to all doctors. Powder marks are most easily removed by lancing each mark and applying a saturated compress of peroxide of hydrogen, which of course is merely a very good antiseptic.

Cuts, burns and wounds, that leave unsightly scars are often cured by having the scarred skin cut away and the healthy skin joined, which heals often without any mark. If a mark is left, however, the electric needle cures this. Sometimes birthmarks are cured so, sometimes they are cured by using a caustic solution.

Moles are treated the same way often, and poe marks from disease.


