PENNA. TROOPS TO LEAVE FOR HOME

Three Infantry Regiments, Engineers and Hospital Men to Go Back.

Camp Stewart, Sept. 28.—Three infantry regiments, a corps of engineers and a field ambulance and field hospital company, Pennsylvania national guard, will entrain next week for home after three months of training along the Mexican border.

The First infantry regiment, first brigade, Philadelphia, will entrain Monday afternoon. Field hospital company No. 2 and field ambulance company No. 2 will also entrain with the first.

The Third infantry regiment, first brigade, of Philadelphia, will entrain Tuesday morning. Brig. Gen. William G. Price, commanding this brigade, and staff officers, will return home with the third.

HUERTA'S BOND TO REMAIN IN BANK

(Continued from Page 1) bond money deposited for her husband, said: "Every cent of money deposited in the Huerta conspiracy cases is still on deposit in local banks to indemnify J. G. McNary and J. J. Heston for having signed these bonds. No money was deposited to secure the bond of Gen. Huerta, for the government refused him that bond. When his attorneys were in the act of suing out a writ of habeas corpus, the government officials had been notified that they had a deportation warrant for him, which meant that he would be deported or incarcerated in the immigration station from which no habeas corpus would lie.

Huerta Preferred Fort. "It was then that Gen. Huerta in open court stated that he preferred to go to Fort Bliss, provided a house was furnished him and he was shown some courtesies and given some liberty. The remaining cases against the other seven or eight defendants have never been tried or disposed of, but as soon as final disposition is made, the bond money, now on deposit, will be returned to rightful owners.

BATTLE OF CARRIZAL TO BE GIVEN IN TABLEAUX IN JUAREZ. Mexican soldiers who were slain in the battle of Carrizal, where two troops of the Tenth U. S. cavalry were overwhelmed by superior numbers last June, will be honored at the Juarez theater Sunday night in a tableaux called "The Battle of Carrizal." Plans announcing the entertainment have been distributed in Juarez. Following a long eulogy of the officers and men who fell to bar the invaders, who were attempting to override an order from the first chief, the spectators will be treated to a tableau which will represent great scenes and characters in Mexican history.

TENTH PENNSYLVANIA IS TO BE SENT HOME

Washington, D. C., Sept. 28.—Names of two more national guard regiments to be returned home from the Mexican border were given to the war department today in dispatches from Maj. Gen. Frederick Funston. They are the First regiment of the New York field artillery and the Tenth Pennsylvania regiment of infantry.
