FAMOUS LA PAZ PLACERS TO BE WORKED EXTENSIVELY

Parker, Ariz., Oct. 25.—After years of financial embarrassment and litigation there now is a prospect that the famous La Paz placers will be worked again for the millions of dollars worth of dust believed still to be in the numerous gravel beds. The main trouble has been the arid nature of the gulches where the gold is found. In the early days this gravel was sorted out and packed down to the river, save in the rainy spells. Now a Los Angeles company is building a five mile pipe line from the river to the top of a hill, where a 2,000,000-gallon reservoir is being blasted from the rock. According to manager B. E. Abercrombie, the gravel banks sample an average of \$150 in gold to the cubic yard and he believes that about 25,000,000 yards are available for sluicing.

SHOW TO WATER HERE, POSSIBLY

If Washington Park Can Be Secured, Wortham Shows Will Remain Here.

The Wortham shows will winter in El Paso if the city council grants the use of Washington park for their winter quarters. W. H. Rice, general agent, has had the matter up with president R. B. Orndorff, of the chamber of commerce, who would be excellent for seeing the cared animals and sheltering the carpenters and painters in rebuilding wagons for next year, while the old stage would be excellent for scene painters. Near the park, ample truckage facilities are afforded, he says, for the 22 cars carried by the organization. Mr. Rice says the company has never spent less than \$20,000 a year on rebuilding its shows and he has letters from San Antonio business men urging him to return there and winter this year. For the past two years the company has wintered there, but Mr. Rice thinks the climate here is best. As a condition for securing the park, Mr. Rice offers to present a public hearing twice a week during the ten weeks of their stay here.

GOLD STRIKE MADE IN DESERT NEAR ARLINGTON

Phoenix, Ariz., Oct. 25.—In the Webb mine, 12 miles west of Arlington, on the desert, at the depth of 116 feet has been developed a 14 foot ledge that samples nearly \$20 to the ton in gold. The ledge is 400 feet long and 100 feet wide. It was discovered by Sam F. Webb in 1880, after he had searched intermittently for the source of rich gold quartz picked up on the plain. The ledge, when finally uncovered under surface earth, was of the knifeblade sort, but wonderfully rich.

Dancing Most Popular In Social Centers Of Chicago and In Schools

Chicago, Ill., Oct. 25.—Despite the opposition of conservatives to dancing, it has proved the most popular form of diversion in Chicago social centers and in public schools, far exceeding gymnastics, dramatics, debate or musicals. Last year the attendance at dancing classes in the public schools was 71,000. The gymnasium classes were second, with a total attendance of 67,419. The schools that did not have dancing had the smallest social centers in town.
