All Nations to Contribute Share of Work; Big State Maps to Be Issued.

Washington, D. C., Nov. 14.—Rapid progress is being made by the United States in preparing its portion of the huge world map which was agreed upon in 1908 by nearly all the principal countries.

Maps Made. To meet the popular demand in this country for state maps, the United States Geological survey, which has charge of the making of the American section of the world map, is preparing and publishing maps of each state on a larger scale than the world map.

Ten Alaskans Believed Drowned. Seward, Alaska, Nov. 14.—News of the probable drowning of ten men was brought here Monday by the mail steamer "Alaska" which was en route to Alaska. Five were white men who set out from Sanak island in a small boat 24 days ago; two white men and three natives who left also on the same day, and the tenth was that of a watchman. All are believed to have been at sea.

Believe Landlady Was Murdered. Spokane, Wash., Nov. 14.—Mrs. Margaret Brown, landlady of the "Portland" hotel, was found dead in her room here late Monday afternoon. The police believe she was murdered. The woman's feet were tied together and secured to the bedposts. The clothing was almost entirely torn from the body and the room showed signs of a violent struggle.

Auto Struck Wagon. Guino Arista, of 1911 South Oregon street, had a narrow escape Monday night when the wagon which he was driving was struck by an automobile near Montana and Kansas streets. Acosta was thrown into the street, sustaining a number of slight bruises. The wagon was badly damaged. The identity of the driver of the automobile has not been ascertained. No damage was done to the car.

President of Big Packing Company Predicts Big Things for El Paso.

He won't admit it, but people who know say that Thos. E. Wilson, president of Wilson and company, dealers in beef and provisions, is the highest paid corporation official in the United States.

"I am going to increase the capacity of our El Paso plant at Virginia and Mills streets, by over 50 percent. This will mean the outfit of about 250,000 and will increase our storage capacity from 150 to 250 car-cases."

El Paso will ultimately become a packing center, continued Mr. Wilson. "We want to keep pace with the town, and we intend to enlarge our plant as fast as the farmers grow and fatten the stuff."

Mr. Wilson has been spending the past three weeks in the Black Range, in New Mexico. He recently visited El Paso Sunday evening, and departed for Chicago in his private car late Monday afternoon.
