BLAMES "DOPE" FOR DOWNFALL; DOCTOR WHO CONFESSES STARBUCKING

Methods of Underworld Exposed; Many Names Given; Doctor Who Furnishes Opium for Local "Hop Head" Fraternity Mentioned; Struggles Toward Reform Proved Useless, Says Prisoner.
