MADDO PLANS NEXT BIG LOAN

Asks Agencies to Keep Organized; Oversubscription, \$682,800,000.

Washington, D. C., June 16.—From every part of the United States today came reports to the treasury, emphasizing how generously nearly 3,000,000 Americans contributed to make the government's first popular war credit a success with the result of oversubscribing the \$2,000,000,000 Liberty loan possibly by \$682,800,000.

Small Subscriptions Surprising. Officials were surprised most of all at the large number of men and women of small means, who bought \$50 and \$100 bonds.


