On March 25, 1917, the United Mine Workers of America signed a written agreement with the United States Coal Co., Denver, Colorado, for a period of three years. This contract was made up by both employer and employee and the mine was working full time when the United Mine Workers of America signed the agreement.

In proof of this I quote the following resolution adopted at a conference between the coal operators and representatives of the United Mine Workers of America in Denver, Colo., on June 15, 1917, the minutes of Gallup reported.

"Considering that it is the duty of every citizen to contribute their efforts towards the success of our government during this most critical period in its history, and that the United Mine Workers of America are a patriotic organization, it is the duty of the United Mine Workers of America to support the government in its efforts to win the war against Germany."

"Copper, Cattle and Cash"

EL PASO is now recognized as the principal market of the United States for range cattle. West Texas, southern New Mexico, southern Arizona and northern Mexico comprise the natural cattle breeding ground of the North American continent.

Nearly one-fourth of the world's supply of copper is produced within the El Paso territory. Several of the largest copper mines in the world, each about equal in value to the assessed valuation of this city are in this district.
