U. S. SUBMARINE BLAST KILLS OFFICER AND FOUR MEN; THREE INJURED

Explosion Occurs in Submarine A-7 at Cavite, Philippine Islands, and is Believed To Have Been Due To Ignition of Gas Within the Craft; Cause of Ignition is Not Yet Known.

WASHINGTON, D. C., July 25.—An explosion yesterday on the submarine A-7 at Cavite, Philippine Islands, killed five and injured three of the crew. The dead as reported today in official dispatches are: Lieut. Arnold Marras; machinist's mate, first class, H. H. Lang; gunner's mate, second class, O. Hopewell; chief electrician J. M. Curry; stowaway's mate, N. A. Kinn.

BRITISH SHIPS FIGHT U-BOATS

Destroyer is Fired at by Submarine and Instantly Sinks

A British Port on the Southeast Coast, July 25.—Just how a British destroyer acts when attacked by a submarine was demonstrated to an Associated Press correspondent while traveling on one of the destroyers driven torpedo boat destroyers from England to France.

The correspondent had been taken aboard the destroyer for the purpose of observing British methods of combating the submarine menace, when the boat was suddenly attacked by a submarine, a torpedo striking it by a stern six feet.
