

EPISCOPAL CHURCH MAY ADD 3 BISHOPS AT OCTOBER MEET

House of Bishops Called To Assemble October 11 in a Special Session; Canadian Churches Take Care of the Wounded Soldiers of Their Membership; Famous Churchmen To Visit Cantonments.

CALL has been issued for a special meeting of the Episcopal House of Bishops. One or two special meetings are usually held during the three years intervening between the general conventions of this church, but the present one is unusual in that it will likely add three new bishops to the already recent leadership number of 1917. The date for the meeting is October 11, and the place St. James church, Chicago. The three new bishops to be chosen are for Salina, which is the western half of Kansas, South Dakota, where a bishop suffragan is proposed for work among Indians, and Panama, where the purpose is to create a jurisdiction in part out of territory ruled by the Church of England, and including the Panama republic and including the Canal Zone, but a considerable part of Central America.

Changes in Episcopal bishops, due to deaths, to infirmities of advanced age and to growth, have been larger than in any one year. There have been no deaths since the last general convention, and after heated contests in elections, showing that some small dioceses are over ambitious for great areas as leaders, and that many simple parishes are beginning of such importance as to require in opportunity the average dioceses. More than 25 individual churches new reports about 100 members, and 20 of the numbers report about 2,000. Tennessee will soon ask for a conductor, it is said, and so will Oklahoma, comprising the Methodist church part of Pennsylvania. Porto Rico is without a bishop, but no mention of it is made in the call just issued.

CHURCHES OF CANADA CARE FOR WOUNDED SOLDIERS Without letting up at all on their war relief work, churches of Canada are now taking on a new work, which is caring for wounded soldiers returned from France. These are found to be about one in four of the total number in the churches, and who are to be more readily cared, most of them permanently, than in previous wars, owing to the nature of the surgery and general medical skill. No estimate is given out of the proportion of deaths, beyond one Montreal Presbyterian church, which contributed 25 men to France, and has no far more from its members. The 25 returned to Canada are being widely distributed through the Dominion, in such places as they themselves desire to go, and where ever there is greatest chance of benefit, churches lending in the expense. In certain provinces of Canada it is found that 25 per cent of men to go to France belonged to the Church of England, and in others the membership of that church is not nearly that proportion of the population. Hence the churches in the provinces named at least, is bearing the larger share of the burden of caring for the returned men wounded.

AUSTRIANS BUY VALLEY ACRES

American Settlers From Globe and Bisbee Pay \$100 Acre on Island.

A colony of Austrians from the Globe and Bisbee districts in Arizona, have purchased 250 acres of unimproved farming land on the island in the San Elmaric grant from the Brown & Wheeler Realty company. The colony, which at present includes about eight families, are all naturalized Americans and among the best citizens of the communities from which they come," said Klockner of the Wheeler company. They do not have any of the Socialistic tendencies common to some of the people of that nationality in connection with the L. W. W. but are practical farmers of good standing.

The land purchased includes survey 168 of the San Elmaric grant and surveys 28 to 40, and part of surveys 41 to 50 of the San Elmaric grant and surveys 51 to 60 of the Wheeler grant. The total purchase price was \$15,000. Among the purchasers were Joseph Vitek, John Letunick, Louis Klockner, Fred Javonick, all of whom have taken possession of their tracts and have commenced improvements in building and land development.

'Mushroom' Type of Concrete Construction and Smooth Finish Features.

The new store and sales room building being constructed for Z. T.
