

OFFICERS AT LEON SPRINGS GET COMMISSIONS AND ARE GRADUATED

Britton Davis Goes To Artillery With Commission as First Lieutenant in Reserves; Erving Schwartz is a Lieutenant in the Quartermaster Corps; Walter Case a Captain in the National Army.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 12.—Major Melvin Kelly instructed the commanding officer of the reserve officers' training camp at Leon Springs to issue commissions to the officers there who have qualified for commissions. Among the list of commissions are a number of El Pasoans. Britton Davis, son of Mr. and Mrs. Walter Davis, is given a commission as first lieutenant in the reserve corps. W. H. Case is given a commission as captain in the national army. Erving Schwartz, son of S. I. Schwartz, is given a commission as second lieutenant in the quartermaster corps. Resolute Smith, son of former congressman and present federal judge W. H. Smith, is given a second lieutenant's commission. C. A. Craven, former assistant United States district attorney for Texas, is made a captain in the national army, as was Alexander Boydston, son of the former United States district attorney for the district, and himself a former assistant district attorney.
