Palacios Ranch of 111,000 Acres to Be Stocked With Cattle and Sheep.

Del Rio, Texas, Nov. 7.—Two Texas ranchmen have shown their confidence in Mexico by buying 111,000 acres of ranch land in the state of Chihuahua.
