

BAPTISTS TO TRAIN MEN TO BE LATIN-AMERICAN MISSIONARIES

Arrangements Are Made for Opening Big Bible Institute in New Orleans Where Latin-American Youths Will Be Trained for the Ministry; Baptists of North Plan Extensive War Work.

BAPTISTS of the south have voted to establish in New Orleans a Baptist Bible institute, and have decided the temporary site of the institute to be the temporary site of the Southern Baptist church in that city.

It is explained that this aim is the training of workers for Latin America. Southern Baptists maintained the foremost Protestant work in Cuba many years before Cuba was free from Spain and they have since endeavored to work and extend it to Central America and to some republics of South America.
