

DALE, LEADING JONES, JONES; ELLERS COUNSEL; FATE OF MAN CHARGED WITH MURDER OF THOMAS LYONS GOES TO JURY THIS AFTERNOON; DALE SAYS PROSECUTION DEPENDS ON CIRCUMSTANCES; REFERS TO 'BIG REWARD' AS THE INCENTIVE; SAYS CHARGE FAILS.

In a masterful summing up of the case for Felix R. Jones, Judge L. A. Dale, leading defense counsel, spoke last Thursday morning to the jury that has heard the evidence on the indictment alleging the murder of Thomas Lyons. Judge Dale digested every bit of evidence in the case and declared the state has failed to make out its charge.

Only one more talk is to be heard by the jury. Assistant district attorney E. B. Ellers will conclude for the state this afternoon, when the jury will be given the matter for deliberation.

Characterizing W. G. Clark, H. M. Holbrook and Mrs. Rose Oyster as the state's three indispensable witnesses, Judge Dale spent over an hour Thursday morning discussing these witnesses alone.

Dwells on Holbrook's Testimony. Holbrook, police officer at the scene of the murder of May 17, according to Judge Dale, had testified Jones was the man who greeted Mr. Lyons at the depot, but witness could not describe anything else, including the chauffeur and the automobile.

LAWYER JUNK IS EFFECTIVE

Council Requires Dealers to Keep Record and Prescribes Their Hours.

An ordinance intended to regulate the business of buying junk in El Paso was passed by the city council in regular session Thursday morning. The ordinance provides that all junk dealers shall keep a book containing record in English of all articles purchased or received in pledge by them with their description. The ordinance provides further:

That it shall be unlawful for any one to act as an agent for any junk dealer not keeping such a record, which shall be open at all times to the inspection of the police; that junk dealers shall not remain open for business after 7:30 p. m. or before 6 a. m. and that violation of this ordinance shall be punishable by a fine of from \$25 to \$100.

City engineer R. M. Williams filed his acceptance of the paving of Myrtle avenue from Angelo to Alameda, extending south to the city limits, during the past week \$51,700 pounds of garbage, 128,000 pounds of ashes, and 10,000 pounds of manure.

City sanitary commissioner L. D. Hillman reported having had 200 children examined; food condemned, 200 pounds of meat and one hog.

Measles Cases Are 14. The weekly report of the health department showed: Deaths, nine Americans, 29 Mexicans and two negroes, total being 49; births, 14 American and 24 Mexican, total 38; contagious disease cases remaining, 14; measles, two scarlet fever, two small pox, one diphtheria, four chicken pox, and ten whooping cough; persons having heads washed and clipped, 139; schools inspected, three, with 296 children examined; food condemned, 200 pounds of meat and one hog.

NEW CAUSTIC SODA PLANT STARTS MIDDLE NEXT WEEK

The caustic soda manufacturing plant of the Southern Chemical company, which is said to have already requisited for its tons per day of its product, will begin operation the middle of next week, according to an announcement. Thursday, twenty-five men will be employed at first. The location of the new industry is just north of the Cottrich school house, northwest of the Southwestern cement plant. R. H. Anderson is the manager.

Raw materials for the manufacture of the caustic soda will come from sulphate of soda deposits 26 miles west of Valmont, a station on the El Paso & Southwestern railroad, just south of Alamogordo, N. M. Motor trucks will move the sulphate to the railroad. Caustic soda is used by soap makers, meat packing houses and other large consumers.

Hill Speaks On High Line Canal Tonight

University Club Open to Those Interested in the Project.

The high line canal and its possibilities for developing hydro electric power, for irrigating bench lands and for draining waterlogged lands in the Rio Grande valley, will be discussed tonight at the University club by Louis C. Hill, consulting engineer, who is here from Los Angeles to make a study of the high line canal project under the Elephant Butte dam.

The meeting will be in charge of the engineering circle of the University club, of which dean S. H. Worrell, of the Texas School of Mines, is chairman. It will be an open meeting and the engineering circle and the club have invited everyone in El Paso and the valleys who are interested in the project to attend and take part in the discussion which will be held following Mr. Hill's talk on the high line canal.

DeW. Worrell will preside. This meeting is to be the first of a series of open meetings of the engineering circle, at which engineers and scientific men of national reputation will address the public. The talk will begin at 8 o'clock and will be held in the lounge room of the University club, seventh floor Martin building.

MRS. ROSE GOSS BOUND TO GRAND JURY; THEFT CHARGE

Mrs. Rose Goss, housekeeper at Hotel Orndorff, was held to the grand jury in \$500 bond by Justices J. M. Neavey Wednesday afternoon on complaint alleging theft over \$50.

The complaining witness, Mrs. S. M. Conwell, testified she was a guest at the hotel February 19 and about \$60 was taken from her room. She said the money was in bills pinned in a box in a linen closet near Mrs. Conwell's room, the total being \$59.50.

C. E. Matthews, known as "Billy Smith," a hotel detective, testified he went to the Orndorff and Mrs. Goss showed him a \$10 bill she had in her stocking, but claimed it was hers. Capt. W. A. Simpson testified she gave him this bill and that it had pin holes that fitted the corresponding holes in the purse. He added that a search revealed some more bills in a linen closet near Mrs. Conwell's room, the total being \$59.50.

HEAVY TRAINS 'WON'T' BEEN

B. R. T. Councilman Says Less Tonnage Per Train Would Save Expense.

That the increase of tonnage being carried by individual freight trains throughout the country is responsible for a great increase of trainmen being "laid off" at any way stations, due to the 16 hour law, and is a foe to the efficient operation of the railroads in the time of war, was the statement made Wednesday evening by T. W. Donnelly, of Tucson, Ariz., a member of the grand executive council of the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen, who arrived in El Paso, to visit E. R. McDaniel, 1408 Wyoming street, also a prominent member of the organization.

"Perhaps the great increase of tonnage on individual trains is relieving congestion, but at what an expense," said Mr. Donnelly. He advocated shorter trains and quick service as a means of efficient service at present.

"It is an admitted proposition that a railroad only makes money when the wheels are turning," he said. "Why won't more money be made if the wheels turn faster?"

Picture Advantages of Service. The happy time when the government will actually own the railroads of the United States, and advantages will be based on service and not on advertising exigencies, was pictured by Mr. Donnelly.

"I do not believe that government ownership will result in a loss of those things included now in what we call service, such as sleeping car facilities, dining cars, observation cars and the like," he said. "But under government ownership these things would be possible only if profitable, and they would be based on the idea of service, not on profit."

Vecheas For Railroad Men. The loyalty of railroad men in the present crisis is being questioned by Mr. Donnelly. He recalled a former convention of the B. R. T. in Detroit in 1916, which was addressed by Col. Theodore Roosevelt. When "Teddy" declared that he would "be delighted" to meet all veterans of the Spanish American war, 56 of the 333 men stood up, and of that number 290 were members of the B. R. T. The speaker said: "The B. R. T. is continuing insurance of all members at the front without payment of premiums, he stated."

Notwithstanding Mr. Donnelly's firm faith in the benefits of government ownership of transportation lines, he is very doubtful whether such a thing is probable at the present time. The problem of how to acquire the lines is not a hard one to him, however.

Would Open New Areas. That government ownership would result in the building of new lines into unopened territory, developing new areas for mining and agriculture, he believed. Private capital is timid, but government capital is not. It would make a special difference on what road a person traveled. Hence all such advantages would be based on service to the public and not competition in service.
