

MEXICAN RADIO HAS WIDE RANGE

Needs Bigger Transmitter to "Talk" With Nauen, Germany, Station.

Only the reception and installation of a powerful transmitter is lacking to complete Mexico's powerful wireless plant on the hill in Chapultepec park, City of Mexico, and give it a range of communication with Nauen, Germany, Paris and London, as well as with Seattle and Arlington on the East coast of the United States, San Francisco, on the west, and San Salvador on the south. This statement was made by Ignacio Galindo, technical director of the Mexican federal telegraph lines, in the national capital last night, and is interesting at this time, owing to the decision of American telegraph companies to restore telephone connections across the Mexican border in Texas, New Mexico and Arizona, which was cut for a few days at some points because of reports that German secret agents were sending information to Mexican border towns by telephone.

Director Galindo said he visited that the purpose of rebuilding and enlarging the Chapultepec radio plant which is under way and contemplated the raising of the three towers to a height of 475 feet above ground, or nearly 600 feet higher than the towers of the other 14 wireless stations operated by the Carranza government. They are situated at Tampico, Turpan, Veracruz, Campeche, Tuxtla Gutierrez, Oaxaca, Amalio, Mazatlan, Chihuahua, Guaymas, San Jose del Cabo, Santa Rosalia and Saltillo. Chihuahua Has Powerful Station. The most powerful of the wireless stations are those of Chihuahua, the towers of which are 290 feet in height, and Saltillo, more than 250 feet high. Mr. Galindo explained that the instruments used at the stations were of various manufacture, the "Telefunken" German and the "DeForest" American systems being among the best. He said that electrical apparatus could be secured in Mexico, but that the purchase of present apparatus would be easier, but admitted that materials for construction were not easy to purchase at present because of the fallings of the war trade board of the United States.

Land Wires Run Down. Mr. Galindo said that communication was made between the Chapultepec plant and those at Havana, Cuba, and San Salvador, Central America, the latter having towers more than 200 feet high. He regarded the improvement of the wireless system throughout Mexico as necessary because of the run down condition of land wires. He said that the Carranza government contemplated installing Marconi apparatus in new stations, especially which Guadalupe was mentioned. This information is corroborative of a lengthy statement by an American woman who recently reached Alvarado, N. M., from Guanajuato, Mexico, and told of the Chapultepec radio plant and others and the connection that Germans in Mexico had with the extension of the system.

Japan Seeking Oil In Mexico For Her Navy

Minister Of Marine Says Investigation Is On, But Details Withheld.

Tokyo, Japan, May 1.—(Correspondence of The Associated Press)—The possibility of the Japanese government securing oil in Mexico came up before the committee on the industrial mobilization of the Japanese diet just before adjournment of that body. Admiral Kato, the minister of marine, said that the government was making investigations with regard to the oil fields in Mexico, but that for diplomatic reasons he could not go into details. The government was also considering the advisability of prospecting for oil in Formosa. Dr. Takahashi, of the house of peers, suggested that Japan should make explorations to dig wells in Mexico without bothering about the views of the United States, and viscount Koyama added that the United States does not scruple about extending her influence in Siberia, Japan need not scruple about refraining from activity in Mexico.

HORSE THIEVES ACTIVE ON RIVER AT FABENS, REPORT

Four horses were stolen from the Wingo ranch in the valley near Fabens Thursday night and three were stolen from the ranch of M. Roy according to an employe of the Wingo ranch, who frustrated another attempt to steal horses by Mexicans Sunday night by firing at them. About a dozen shots were exchanged without injury to any one. Several other horses have been stolen at that district lately by Mexicans, it was said. There is horse stealing nearly every night, the informant said, Mexicans on the Texas side of the river who steal the horses round the animals up and send them over to the border. 
