"But After Primary They'll Find Me Extending Right Hand of Friendship," Says Cobb, in Opening City Speech at Alta Vista Auditorium; Miss Dietrich Gives Hudspeth Record; Candidate Deals in Facts.

"THERE are some good people supporting Hudspeth. Why? In the beginning, before the people made known their wishes, these same jangled what they thought was a Hudspeth bandwagon. But now they find themselves riding on a horse. But after the primary, they will come back and they will find me, flushed with victory, extending the right hand of friendship to them."

"This was the confident statement of Zach Lamar Cobb, candidate for congress at the meeting of the precinct 12 Cobb club, held at the Alta Vista school Friday night. The statement was significant in that it was made on the basis of Mr. Cobb's return from a tour of the entire congressional district where he received with open arms, even in Bandera county, the acoust of Hudspeth's childhood.

The auditorium of the Alta Vista school was almost overflowing with people. The entire precinct was a number of children. Rev. C. K. Campbell, pastor of Trinity Park Methodist church, presided over the meeting, and in a short introductory talk, explained that this was his first political speech.
