IMPROVES FIRE ALARM SYSTEM

New Switchboard, Costing \$4400, Being Installed; Firemen Get \$100. Trouble in the switchboard of the new fire alarm system being installed in the El Paso fire department central station today by C. F. Maulen of the Gamewell Fire Alarm company, will result in the installation of only one eighth of the fire boxes of the city, instead of half, as was the case under the old system. The new board is an eight circuit marble one, and the lines from the boxes of the city are carried on eight distinct circuits independent of each other. This means that any trouble on any of these circuits will not interfere with the operation of the other seven circuits, so that only one eighth of the city system will be out of order at once. Under the old two circuit system, any trouble with either circuit meant that half the fire boxes in El Paso would not work at that time.
