WASHINGTON, D. C., June 5.—In every state, territory, county and town in the United States, young men who have become 21 years of age since June 5, 1917, were today registered for military service.

It was estimated by provost marshal general Hinch Crowder that nearly 1,000,000 men would be registered today.
