SCHOOLS OF AVIATION MECHANICS are located in various parts of the country.

Their Purpose Is

to provide a competent expert force of mechanics for the naval air fleet now being prepared and trained for service abroad. Upon the ability of its graduates depends the success of this branch in the World War.

If you are an American citizen; if you have a fair education; if you know anything about gasoline engines; if you have overhauled the family jitney; if you know anything about Magneto Work, Carburetors; if you can take up bearings; fit piston rings, or if you are versed in assembly work or machine tool work, you are eligible and your country needs you.

Qualifications

If you are a cutter, cloth fitter, upholsterer, carriage or auto top maker or trimmer, canvas worker, tentmaker, tailor, interior finisher, interior decorator, fresco painter, large sign painter, wagon or carriage painter, furniture finisher, auto, carriage or truck painter, varnisher, wire or rope worker, cabinet maker or woodworker, blacksmith, coppersmith, you are eligible for training as an aviation mechanic and your country needs you.

Military experts have agreed that the aeroplane and hydro-aeroplane will play a stupendous part in the coming months of the great struggle. The United States navy offers to train you, to send you to school, to teach you Aviation Mechanics, a line that you will be able to pursue after the war, and at the same time you will be serving your country.

To be eligible, you must be an American citizen between the ages of 21 and 35. You must either have had some practical experience with gas engines or you must have a fair technical education covering internal combustion motors.

Three months' free schooling is given with full pay. Excellent instructors will give each scholar individual attention. Students are given detailed training in the operation and upkeep of high speed, Aeronautical motors. Practical work as well as theory is gone into thoroughly. Advanced instruction will cover all the latest types of Aeroplane motors, including the famous "Liberty."

Promotion Is Rapid

At the end of the three months' training the student is graduated and given the rating of petty officer.

Promotion is made according to the ability shown by the man in both practical work and theory and the possibilities for advancement are unlimited.

Pay

Not only free schooling, that will greatly benefit men when the war is over, is given, but Aviation Mechanics receive more pay than any other enlisted man of equal rank in either the army or navy.

A first class machinist receives \$66.00 per month together with all living expenses. He is allowed to have \$10,000 life insurance and, if married, he may set aside \$15.00 per month to be paid his wife to which the government will add \$15.00. In case he may have a family or other dependents the department makes further financial allowances.

Remember that automobile mechanics or men who have had experience with automobiles and the repair of same are considered especially adaptable for this work. Tool makers and machinists are given special consideration.
