Commander Howe Stresses Need of Good Relations With Mexico at Chamber of Commerce Luncheon; Says Somebody Formerly Failed in Duty; Tom Lea Starts Fund for City Troop, Texas Cavalry.

THE necessity of fostering good relations with Mexico and thus defeating German attempts to create friction on the border and thus neutralize large bodies of American troops was stressed in a brief but emphatic talk by Brig. Gen. Robert L. Howe, commander of the district, at the monthly luncheon of the chamber of commerce, Wednesday noon at Hotel Sheldon.

The meeting was an enthusiastic one, all of the features being an immediate response to an appeal of Tom Lea, former mayor, that \$500 be contributed at once towards the raising of a troop of leading men in the federalized Texas guard. Subscriptions totaling \$155 were made up in a few minutes.

Otis C. Cole, president of the chamber, called the meeting to order and in a brief introductory address urged the necessity of working first for winning the war, then promoting good relations between the two countries, and finally for the promotion of the Texas guard.
