

DELEGATES TO THE NATIONAL COMMITTEE GETS \$492,345; SPENDS LESS; \$11,000 TO N. Mex.

Washington, D. C., Oct. 28.—The Republican national committee's detailed report on pre-election expenses, filed last night, showed total receipts of \$492,345, and expenditures of \$462,694, most of which was sent toward the various state campaigns.

The largest contributions were \$5000 each by J. Ogden Armour and J. H. Taylor, of Chicago, and Alfred J. Sweet, of Auburn, Maine. The other contributions ranged down to \$50.
