Two Alleged Germans Sent To U. S. "Pen"

Freese Gets Five Years and Kloth Three In Famous 105 Mile Gun Case.

Claus Freese was sentenced to five years in the federal penitentiary at Leavenworth, Kan., by United States District Judge W. H. Smith Wednesday afternoon, on technical charges of crossing into Mexico and returning to the United States without permits.

The men, however, admitted having attempted to sell to the German consul in Juarez plans of a new type of gun that would shoot 195 miles.

Freese was said to be the inventor and to have had the plans. The men admitted having crossed into Mexico via Clint, Tex.

Would "Swindle Germany." It developed during previous proceedings to the case that the German consul had purchased the plans. Freese said in court that he had attempted to sell the plans to the United States government, and was informed the gun was not practical, whereupon he tried to sell it to the German consul, "swindling" the German government.

Both Freese and Kloth are said to be natives of Germany.

Others sentenced by Judge Smith during the afternoon were: Tom Palacios, having forged money, one year and a day; Seloncio Luna, having stolen a car, one year and a day; Miguel Espinosa and Alfredo Ayala, violating passport laws, 90 days each; Martin Moreno, attempt to smuggle arms, 90 days; Carlos and Pedro Hernandez, violating liquor laws, two months.

German Papers Charge Russ Spread Seditious Literature In Berlin

Copenhagen, Denmark, Nov. 7.—The diplomatic break between Germany and the Russian soviet government, which developed yesterday, was fore-shadowed by the Berlin newspapers a week ago when they charged that the Russian embassy in Berlin was the central point for the distribution of seditious literature. They pointed out that more than 400,000 copies had been distributed by M. Joffe, the Russian ambassador, during the short period he had been in Berlin.

GERMAN FINANCIAL STATE CLOSE TO BREAKING POINT

London, Eng., Nov. 7.—(By British Wireless Service)—Germany's financial position is described as rapidly approaching the breaking point. After also raising her eighth war loan her national debt, it is estimated, approached \$3,000,000,000 pounds sterling. It is assumed that since then it has reached 7,000,000,000 pounds. On June 23, last, the reichstag adopted a vote of credit of 15,000,000,000 marks, which it was declared would raise Germany's war debt to 125,000,000,000 marks, or nearly 7,000,000,000 pounds.

Assuming that the debt stands now at 142,000,000,000 marks, Germany has mortgaged therefore more than two-fifths of her national wealth, estimated at 149,000,000,000 pounds.

AMERICAN CONSUL KILLED AT CHARLOEROI, IS REPORT

Amsterdam, Holland, Nov. 7.—The American consul and seven British war prisoners have been killed by the bombardment of Charleroi, southwest of Namur, in Belgium, according to Berlin dispatches received here. The names of the consul is given as Eugene Davens.

Before the war, the United States maintained no consul at Charleroi, and no information is available to indicate the identity of any consular agent who might be referred to in the Amsterdam dispatch. The report may refer to a British agent, who, prior to the war, acted as consular agent for the United States.

EMPRESS VISITS BOHEMIA AS PRIVATE INDIVIDUAL

Basel, Switzerland, Nov. 7.—(By Press Zita) has asked permission of the Prague government to go, with her children, to Bohemia, according to the Prague Telegraph.

The government, in its reply, consented to the empress's visit into Bohemia as a private individual.

WILL GURB GAME HOG IN EL PASO

Sportsmen Form An Association; Will Have A Game Warden.

Game hogs and those who shoot birds out of season are going to be prosecuted in El Paso. The sportsmen of the city are going to help enforce the laws. El Paso county has no game, simply because it has been shot out of season and killed off. The sportsmen are going to see that this is stopped.

Twenty of them met Wednesday afternoon with Theo. Rosault, Jr., game warden of New Mexico, and after discussing the appointment of a game warden for El Paso county, to serve in this county and along the border of Dona Ana county, N. M., organized an association for the protection of game.

Mr. Rosault represented the state fish and game commissioner of Texas at the meeting Wednesday, as well as a big game expert. He informed the El Pasoans that he had an agreement with the Texas official by which the two states would jointly maintain a game warden if he was given the proper support by the sportsmen, hunting to the hunters and those who hunt out of season.

Form An Association. The El Pasoans were enthusiastic over the plan and immediately formed a temporary organization, with George G. Neville as chairman and George G. Neville as temporary secretary.

Mr. Rosault agreed to arrange to have Aldo Leopold, of the New Mexico Game Protective association, come to El Paso on Friday, November 22, and give a talk on the preservation of game. He will bring some fine slides and show them, too. Each El Pasoan present at the meeting Wednesday agreed to bring one or more sportsmen to the meeting when Mr. Leopold visits the city, at which time a permanent organization will be formed.

Mr. Shelton appointed Benjamin Sherrod, E. L. Barrow and C. C. Gaines as a committee to prepare a bill for the association, to be submitted for adoption at the meeting when Mr. Leopold is in the city.

Mr. Rosault advised the members present for a recommendation for appointment as game warden, and Mr. Rosault will be Wednesday evening for Columbus, N. M., but was back in the city today.

Any sportsmen in the city desiring to join the association to help enforce the laws and preserve the game can do so by calling on Mr. Neville, at the W. G. Wall company.
