Harris, now in Idaho, that he had just returned from the front four days after the armistice was signed and was looking forward to the opportunity of telling her about Chateau Thierry, St. Mihiel and the fighting about Verdun but was apprehensive his outfit would be sent into German territory with the army of occupation which would delay his discharge.
