

ROOSEVELT'S WILL IS FILED

Widow Gets Income of Estate, Probably Worth More Than \$500,000.

Albany, N. Y., Jan. 11.—While the value of Theodore Roosevelt's estate is not disclosed in the former president's will, it is estimated to exceed \$500,000. The income of the estate is bequeathed to Mrs. Roosevelt, who is authorized to dispose of the principal to their children in any way she desires.

The will of Theodore Roosevelt, third uncle, divides a trust fund of \$50,000 into equal shares for each of his children, bequeaths wedding presents given at the marriage of his first wife, to his daughter, Alice, and the residue of his estate to the executors of the will in trust.

The executors are directed to apply the income of the estate to the use of the widow, and authorize Mrs. Roosevelt to dispose of the principal of the trust to his children in such shares and portions and either absolutely or upon any trust or limitation, respectively, as she shall direct.

No Inventory Required. The will directs that the executors need not be required to file an inventory of the estate, and that the executor in and sell and partition any of his real and personal property and also the same to the several legatees as provided by the will.

Mrs. Roosevelt, Theodore Roosevelt, Jr., and George Elton Roosevelt are named as executors. The will is dated December 13, 1912.

The Women's Bar association, of Roosevelt, N. Y., is preparing a bill to be presented in the legislature to amend the law to give to the widow the privilege of serving as juror.
