Federal Representatives Meet At Denver To Discuss Labor Problem.

Denver, Colo., Feb. 20.—The directing heads of the federal employment offices in this city and in middle and western states are meeting here today for the purpose of outlining some plan for the immediate solution of the unemployment problem.

NO SHIPBUILDING WAGE ADVANCES CONSIDERED

Washington, D. C., Feb. 20.—No shipbuilding wage advances are being considered, director general Egan, of the emergency fleet corporation, said today, referring to Seattle and other ports where labor troubles have arisen.

WALKER HAS SHIPPED TOTAL OF 300 TO FIGHT PEST

The United States employment bureau shipped 300 men to Harlow, Ward county, Thursday morning for work in the government's cleanup campaign in the boll weevil land. Three-fourths of these were Americans. The wages paid are \$2 a day and board, eight hours a day, with free transportation both ways. The work will last one month, it was said at the employment office.

CONCILIATOR MAY SETTLE BOILERMAKERS' STRIKE

Washington, D. C., Feb. 20.—Conciliation commissioner Edward White has been assigned by the department of labor to attempt settlement of a controversy between shipyard owners and boilermakers in Alameda county, California, where 10,000 men are on strike because of the alleged refusal of employers to meet the men's committee.

WILSON AND GOVERNORS TO DISCUSS UNEMPLOYMENT

Cincinnati, O., Feb. 20.—A conference of governors, to be presided over by president Wilson, for the solution of unemployment, has been called by the department of labor for early in March, the exact date and place to be fixed when the president returns to Washington.

FAIL TO SETTLE STRIKE

Washington, D. C., Feb. 20.—Conferences Wednesday between representatives of the Building Trades Employers' association, building trades unions and officials of the war and labor departments failed to result in agreement for settlement of the threatened nationwide strike. Further conferences are planned.

RIO GRANDE OIL COMPANY TO BUILD REFINERY HERE

The Rio Grande Oil Co., with an agency in El Paso, is to build a refinery here and has purchased 100 acres of ground on the old Thurmond property, near the Morris stockyards, for the plant, which is to have 10 fire units of about 1900 barrels a day completed in about 90 days, it is said.

George E. Foster, El Paso, has purchased an estate at Red Bank, N. J., and with his family will move there between the first and middle of March. Red Bank is a few minutes from Seabright and near Shrewsbury river.

Washington, D. C., Feb. 20.—A bill for the repeal of the war time prohibition law, which becomes effective March 1, introduced by representative G. W. Gulliver, of Massachusetts, will be considered by the house agricultural committee within the next few days.

SENATORS URGE MODIFIED WOMAN SUFFRAGE MEASURE

Washington, D. C., Feb. 20.—Women suffrage proponents to the senate announced they were considering plans to obtain enactment at this session of a new, modified measure, as a substitute for the defeated Anthony resolution. The new measure, drafted by senator Jones, would confer the right of suffrage upon women by constitutional amendment, but only to the extent that men are permitted to vote in the several states. It is designed to meet objection of southern senators.

Washington, D. C., Feb. 20.—The senate banking and currency committee has agreed informally that no action should be taken at the next session of congress on the bill of senator Weeks to abolish the office of controller of the currency.
