DEMPSEY STARTS TRAINING GRIND

Challenger for Heavyweight Title Has Begun Real Work for Contest.

Toledo, O., May 17.—Juffed to the ears in a heavy sweater, Jack Dempsey, challenger for the world's heavyweight championship, was up early today for the first round work of his training grind for his championship battle with Jess Willard here July 4.

The object of the stunt was to keep the challenger from growing stale through inactivity until he can locate a place for his training camp.

Dempsey plans to establish quarters Monday on the shores of Maumee bay, about three miles from the site of the arena. He will do his boxing and gymnasium work out of doors in as much as the championship battle is to be fought in the open.

BENNY LEONARD MEETS BRITTON

Light and Welter Champs Will Clash During the Week of June 9.

New York, May 17.—The boxing stage is being set for a bout between Benny Leonard and Jack Britton, the welterweight champion, in Newark the week of June 9. This bout will have even the Leonard-Britton affair in the financial shade and will draw close to \$1,000, for both of the Leonard-Britton contests now on the records were close and Britton this time will enter the ring with the added prestige that comes from having knocked out Kid Lewis for the welterweight title.

Some Bout. "If Britton can stop Lewis at 135 pounds, what will he do to Leonard, who will weigh 140 to 145 pounds?" Nothing to it, as far as we can see. Britton nearly stopped Leonard last summer in their district bout in Philadelphia and Jack will be in better shape this time.

A bout between Leonard and Britton would give Leonard a chance to add the welterweight championship to his lightweight title, but Britton would not take the lightweight championship even if he came into the ring at 145 and stopped Leonard.


