

SCHOOL SUPT. TIGHE RESIGNS; HAS BETTER PLACE

City Loses One of Its Most Valuable Assets, Stevens Tells School Board; Adjustment of Teachers' Salaries Is Discussed; Franklin School Principal Denounces the Conditions and Asks for a Transfer.

RICHARD J. TIGHE, superintendent of city schools for the past six years, tendered his resignation to the school board at its regular meeting Tuesday evening.

Charles R. Stevens, one of the board, announced that "the city will lose one of its most valuable assets in Mr. Tighe and that it will be with much regret that the schools will look upon his absence."

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In tendering his resignation, Mr. Tighe wrote that he had accepted the candidacy for superintendent of the city of about 40,000 population, and had been unanimously elected Monday.

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POSSE RETURNS FROM MOUNTAIN HUNT

Condemned Man Still Fugitive in Mountains of New Mexico.

Santa Fe, N. M., June 18.—Sheriff George W. Arajo and his posse have returned from a vain hunt in the mountains round about Santa Fe for Isidoro Martinez, who, while under 60 days' reprieve from death sentence, escaped from the sheriff's custody.

The fugitive had been traced in jail during his trial and had endeavored himself to the sheriff's children in such a way as to gain the complete confidence of the sheriff and his assistants. He had never made as much as a motion that would indicate that he would take any chance to flee. Efforts to recapture him will not be relaxed.

Whatever chance he had to have his death sentence commuted by governor Larrazolo, he has probably lost. He had been sentenced for the murder of his wife near Santa Cruz two years ago.

CAN GOMPERS TELL DIFFERENCE? Editor Herald: Samuel Gompers has been quoted as follows: "From the time of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, 137 of the conception of the United States, the prohibition question is the first that has ever actually involved denial of the right of people to do things."

"What is going to happen if the habits of the people are suddenly changed overnight? Look at Russia. Since vodka was suppressed entirely it is a fact that there have been more cases of alcoholism in the hospitals than ever before in the history of that country."

If Mr. Gompers is quoted rightly, he is undoubtedly laboring under a misconception of the laws of the United States, which while they grant the rights of the people, also deny the people the right to do some things which interfere with the rights of others and are not compatible with the public welfare.

Then the prohibition question is not, it cannot be, the first that has ever actually involved denial of the right of people to do things. As an illustration, I will refer Mr. Gompers to the fact that in the prohibition convention it was actually, not only involved, but established a denial of the right of the people to hold slaves, long before the prohibition question became a national issue.
