

FLYERS KILLED EN ROUTE HERE

One Victim of the Accident Near Del Rio Is Lieut. William F. Baer.

San Antonio, Texas, June 21.—Two army aviators, whose names could not be learned last night, were killed and two planes of squadrons flying from Hillington Field, Houston, Texas, to the Texas border were wrecked Friday at Del Rio, Texas, according to a message from there.

The death of the two aviators occurred when they were starting a flight to Del Rio, Texas, and the aviator who was killed shortly after the other fell or jumped out, receiving injuries from which he died shortly afterward. The pilot, strapped in the machine, was hurled beyond recognition. The second accident occurred when another plane, attempting to rise, overturned. A third plane, the message said, was wrecked while making a landing Thursday.

Lieut. Baer One Killed. Detroit, Mich., June 21.—Lieut. William F. Baer, an army aviator, stationed at Hillington Field, Houston, Texas, was killed Friday when his airplane fell near Del Rio, Texas, according to a message from the field commandant to the aviator's relatives. Baer's home was at Wheeling, W. Va.

PRESIDENT LAUDS UNDOUBTABLE SPIRIT OF BELGIAN POPULACE

BRUSSELS, Belgium, June 21.—At the dinner given this week in honor of president and Mrs. Wilson by the king and queen of Belgium with cardinal Mercier and other distinguished guests present, the president, addressing king Albert, spoke as follows:

"Let me express, sir, the very appreciation with which I have heard your remarks. You truly say that I have come to Belgium to express my own deep personal interest and sympathy with her sufferings and interest in her prosperity; but I would have no personal consequence if it were not my privilege for the time being to represent the people of the United States."

Expresses Feeling of U. S. "What gives me confidence in expressing this sympathy and interest is that I know in expressing those sentiments that I am expressing the feelings of the people of the United States. There has never been in the United States a more general and universal combination of sympathy with the affairs of another nation than that which the people of the United States have had for the affairs and the people of Belgium."

Are Democratic People. "I have made many points of sympathy between the people whom I have the pleasure of representing and the people whom you represent. They are a very democratic people and it has been very delightful to find, sir, that you are a true democrat. All that you have said in your address are parts of the leaders and one of the things that give confidence in the future of Belgium is the consciousness that one has of the self-reliance and indomitable spirit of her people."

Soldier Welcomed Home From War By Friends

Washington, D. C., June 21.—Capt. Edmund G. Chamberlain, U. S. marine corps, of San Antonio, who was tried by court martial in London recently, on charges that his exploits on the French front, for which he was recommended for the congressional medal of honor and the Victoria cross, were false, has arrived here and is awaiting the verdict of the court.

Capt. Chamberlain arrived in Boston from overseas on the Winnsreda, July 1, and reached Washington yesterday. His father, Edwin Chamberlain, of San Antonio, met the officer at Boston and is with him here. Mr. Chamberlain, sr., will remain here with the captain until the verdict is made public. The verdict is not expected to be made public at the navy department for a month.

While Capt. Chamberlain and his father return to discuss it in any way, owing to military regulations which forbid an officer from talking of a court martial, enough was learned today at the navy department, the marine corps headquarters and in conversations with other officers to indicate the conviction that Capt. Chamberlain actually performed the exploits described on the battle front, and that the court martial proceedings in London were brought to "save the face" of a high British officer who would otherwise have been disgraced.

Capt. Chamberlain was charged with perjury, forgery and desertion. During the latter part of May it was reported in London that the court martial had acquitted Chamberlain of the charges of perjury and forgery, but the vote on the falsehood charge was not indicated.

Texas friends of Chamberlain here, as well as Texas congressmen, are confident that the navy department's decision makes public the verdict the San Antonio man will be completely acquitted and that the decorations which those who have investigated the truth of his exploits believe are due him, according to the first recommendations.

An indication of the trumped up nature of the charges was shown when the London court threw out of the testimony the report of Gen. Salmon and the testimony of a British handwriting expert, Wilford M. Webb.
