Operators Keep Close Watch On The Rust Trio

Sun Company Well No. 6 Making Three Hundred Barrels A Day.

Ranger, Tex., June 24—Oil operators have been watching the Rust trio for some time, for the wells are expected in at any time. Thursday the Sun company brought in their No. 6 well at a depth of 2500 feet. The well has been making 200 barrels of oil every hour, but it is expected that it will settle down to a steady flow of 200 barrels a day. The other two wells, the No. 4 and No. 5 are drilled at the same depth as the No. 6 and are expected to come in at any moment. These three wells are located four miles west of Ranger.

Operations in the Eastland District Given Big Impetus.
Ranger, Tex., June 24—Operations in the Eastland district have again been spurred on by bringing in a good producer in the very center of the Imperial Oil and Development Co. and is good for more than 500 barrels. As soon as the hole was moved it is likely that the well will be shot. Oil is now standing 1500 feet in the well. The depth of the well is 2500 feet.

OKLAHOMA EXPECTS ANOTHER OIL BOOM

According to Oklahoma City, Okla., press reports, a new era of oil boom is being heralded in that state in Oklahoma. This time it is for the supposed deep sands instead of the shallow, which was not found and upon which millions were said to have been expended. It is said that this new inspiration was got from Ranger, Tex., where the big pay was found at from 2500 to 2600 feet.

DRILLING SUSPENDED

Bozwell, Ark., June 24—Drilling of the test well of the Silver Circle Oil Company has been suspended temporarily, owing to lack of 50 inch casing. The well, by this time, is at a depth of 231 feet. The company plans to sink to a depth of 4000 feet, if necessary.

OIL LAND PRICES SOAR

The report of the Burkle well, in the center of Block 72, in the Burkholder field, in Wichita county, Tex., having a hole standing full of oil, means a rise in the price of oil land. The well is at a depth of 231 feet and is expected by observers of the famous "Trio" that the No. 4 and 5 will come in at any hour.

NEAR PAY SAND

The local office of the Silver Circle Oil Company has received the news that that concern's well has reached a depth of 1900 feet. The opinion was expressed that at the rapid rate the drill was making that the sand would be reached Monday or Tuesday of this week.

TO DRILL NEAR TINNIE

A Roswell, N. M., dispatch says that the Roswell Oil Development company has leased a considerable area of land near Tinnie, 50 miles westward from Roswell. The contract calls for drilling to commence at once.
