BOODY OF MURDER VICTIM TAKEN TO SANTA FE

SANTA FE, N. M., Aug. 4.—The body of Juan Lobato, killed in a stabbing street at El Paso, was brought to Santa Fe for burial. Lobato was killed in a railroad camp while being remonstrated with by a cook over the food. The cook, a citizen of Mexico, drew a knife and plunged it into Lobato's heart. The murderer made good his escape. Joseph Miller, another Santa Fean, who worked at El Paso, recognized the body Miller had been stabbed in the head and one leg by the furious cook.
