Business Men Of Chihuahua Get On Well

Trade Is Reported Good and Business Houses Are All Prospering.

Chihuahua, Mex., Oct. 20.—It is a remarkable fact that notwithstanding the ravages suffered by the merchants all over Chihuahua in the last three years, not a single failure has been recorded. In general, during the last year of the trouble in that city more than 40,000 pesos, Mexican gold, were taken in provisions and cash from the local dealers, and at present all is going on as usual in that rich mining town.

Trade is taking new life and for the first time traffic in certain commodities is developing between this city and certain sections of the state. Appeals are being brought by the curandero from Chihuahua (near Guerrero) and from Chihuahua, some miles from Sanchez station, the western terminus of the Kansas City, Mexico and Orient railroad; these from the district bordering Sonora and Chihuahua, an account of the high prices paid in the local market, from places more than three hundred miles from Chihuahua.

DEFEAT FOR THE STATE OR LAWS REBEL BANDITS BE ENFORCED

Federal Troops Are Pressing Villistas Through- out Chihuahua. District Attorney Explains Provisions of the New Statute.

The new Texas state prohibition law, which goes into effect at midnight tonight, will be rigidly enforced in El Paso county, according to Leigh Clark, district attorney, who Monday issued the following statement: "The second called session of the legislature which convened June 21 and adjourned July 27, passed a state-wide intoxicating liquor prohibition law."

The law was for the purpose of amplifying and making more effective the recent prohibition amendment to the state constitution. The law is chapter 78 of the second called session act of the legislature and this law takes effect at midnight tonight.

Intoxicating Liquor Defined. "Intoxicating liquors are defined as medicinal liquors, or any potable liquor, mixture or preparation, containing in excess of one percent of alcohol by volume or any equivalent for making such liquors, except for medicinal, mechanical, scientific or agricultural purposes."

Provisions of the act do not prohibit the possession of intoxicating liquor in any quantity for use by the owner and members of his family, or bona fide guests, in a bona fide household. The act prohibits the purchase and possession of such liquor for sale to persons having permits to sell alcohol or wine in wholesale quantities to persons having permits to sell alcohol or wine in wholesale quantities.

There are many other provisions of the law which prohibit wholesale and retail druggists and other persons from selling, or having in their possession, any quantity of medicinal, mechanical, scientific or agricultural liquors.
