

WILL BRYAN NAME DEMOCRATIC CANDIDATE AGAIN THIS YEAR?

FAITHFUL followers of Champ Clark are urging him to throw his hat in the presidential ring. The old Democratic wheelhorse from Missouri has not formally announced his candidacy and may not do so, but there can be no doubt that he stands ready to lead his party if the call comes, and it seems more likely that he will be among the entries at the San Francisco free for all in June.

Clark was cheated out of the presidency in 1912. In that memorable political year, owing to the Republican split, the Democratic nomination was equivalent to election, a majority of the delegates in the Baltimore convention voted for the Missourian. One more ballot would have given him the nomination, had it not been for the sudden turn by Bryan, who, in spite of instructions from his state to vote for Clark, swung his followers to Wilson at the critical stage. Bryan now admits his mistake and is said to be willing to square his conduct by supporting the man he kept out of the white house eight years ago.
