The American, according to the Sonora revolutionary authorities, was warned to return to the American side of the border.

Fifty Carranza soldiers passed through Pulpito pass, in the mountains dividing Chihuahua and Sonora yesterday, according to information given out at military headquarters.

Gen. J. M. Pina, military commander of the district, was announced, had moved to within a few miles of Pulpito pass, with the majority of soldiers under his command.

Another Pacific coast port of Mexico, Mazatlan, Colima, is believed to be revolutionary forces, according to an official bulletin issued by the Sonora military.

Ortiz Reaches Juarez, Police Disperse Crowd

A crowd of several thousand people greeted Andres Ortiz, candidate for governor of the state of Chihuahua, on his arrival in Juarez in his private car Sunday afternoon.

The streets of the city were decorated in the red colors of the Ortiz party, and a long line of paraders, carrying campaign flags, headed by a band, marched in the depot to welcome the candidate.

A noisy reception was given Mr. Ortiz as he stepped from the car. He was addressed by a warty automobile, from which short speeches were made by Lieut. Col. Socio and Lieut. Octavio M. Trigu, captain, in ward, Mr. Ortiz was introduced as the candidate of the people.

Mr. Ortiz acknowledged the greeting of the people in a short talk, and stated the principles of his platform. A procession started through the streets, led by mounted police, and the principal speakers of the day, driven to the home of Jose Lopez Lara.
