From The Herald of This Date, 1906.


REPORTS from Manila, P. I., state that bands of rebels have rifled many houses, wounding the residents and taking prisoners.



Questions and Answers.

- Q. Should corn be cultivated deeply after it is above ground? F. H. L.
A. The first cultivation should be quite deep, three or four inches. Afterward it should not be more than two to two and a half inches. Some of the corn roots soon shoot out toward the middle of the row and lie near the surface of the soil. Deep cultivation tears out these roots and reduces the yield ten to 20 bushels an acre.
Q. What percentage of deaths are due to accidents? M. E. N.
A. Insurance statistics for the United States show that the deaths of ten out of every 100 men who die, or ten percent, are due to accidents. These statistics show that on an average, every nine minutes someone is killed by accident in the United States; every 24 minutes someone is killed by a fall; every 62 minutes someone is killed in a railroad accident; every 12 minutes someone is fatally burned; every 50 minutes someone is drowned; and every 140 minutes someone meets death in an automobile accident.
Q. Is baseball played in the Philippines? W. T.
A. This game is very popular in the islands and is played on one end of the archipelago to the other.
Q. Are business killed for men in this country? W. D.
A. In September, 1919, federal inspection of horse slaughter began. Up to the end of the year 423 horses were slaughtered and about half the resulting meat was certified for export.
Q. Can there be two full moons in any February? A. M. H.
A. There have not and cannot be two full moons in the month of February at any one place. February has at most but 29 days, while the shortest possible intervals between successive full moons is 29 days and six hours.
Q. Were there many words in the vocabulary of an uncivilized Indian tribe? F. M. O.
A. The Smithsonian Institution says that the old idea that the vocabulary of uncivilized tribes, especially the Indian tribes, was very limited, has been disproven. They have every reason to believe that the vocabulary of such tribes was quite as large as that of modern languages, and that such tribes were able to express the most complicated ideas.
Q. Where do we get the expression "stand pat"? E. A. D.
A. This is a political slang expression and was originated by senator Hanna, in 1902, to indicate the attitude of the leaders of the Republican party on the tariff question. It came from "stand pat," a poker term
