ARIZONA BOARD TO HOLD FREE CLINIC FOR CHILDREN

Phoenix, Ariz., May 25.—The state board of health has announced that a free clinic for examination of children would be held here Saturday. Children who are anemic or who have been exposed to tuberculosis infection will receive particular attention. It was stated. For children found to have adenoids or enlarged or infected tonsils, provision will be made later for correction of these defects, the board declared.

Mexican Labor Takes Advantage Of Free Bureau

Already 100 Mexican laborers are applying for work each day at the free labor bureau, established recently under the supervision of the revolutionary government, with offices at the Theater X in Juarez.

The establishment of this bureau, the chief purpose of which is to provide employment for Mexican contract laborers wishing to enter the United States because of the higher wages paid here, became necessary, because the contractors for furnishing them here, were unable to pay the cost of their passage to the United States. The bureau is free to both the peon and the man who employs him. The only expense to which the peon is put, is a charge of \$2 by the Mexican consul for issuing his passport.

They were sentenced to three years in the penitentiary. The woman, who admits she is not Brown's wife, has a small child with her. She was suspended during good behavior. She says she will go to Santa Fe and remain until Brown is released from the penitentiary.
