Dudley Seeks Better Trade With Mexico

Austin, Tex., June 2.—Senator Dudley, of El Paso, yesterday introduced a bill in the senate authorizing certain corporations organized under Texas laws to act as customs brokers in Mexico under other foreign countries. This bill is designed to improve trade relations with Mexico.

LOW TO RENT RAILROAD ASKED

Washington, D. C., June 2.—Delegations from Del Rio, Sonora, and other points along the Rio Grande railroad, will appear today before the interstate commerce commission to urge a loan of \$2,500,000 from the government to finance the road for the improvement of local lines. The amount of this sum \$1,200,000 is desired for the floating debt of \$1,400,000 for improvements and the balance for equipment.




