

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS


Q. Do farmers have large families now-a-days? E. H. T.
A. A recent report shows surprising figures in regard to children in farm homes. There was but an average of 1.15 under 10 years of age to each home, and 0.15 between 10 and 14 years. The number of children in eastern rural homes is the lowest, and on the Pacific coast the highest.
Q. What are the duties of a secretary of state? who was the first one, and what is the present salary? L. H. P.
A. The secretary of state has charge of foreign affairs, consular agencies, and diplomatic matters. He is the ranking member of the cabinet, each of whom receives a salary of \$12,000. Thomas Jefferson was the first secretary of state.
Q. Who was the tallest man in our army during the world war? P. A. H.
A. Honor parks, a sergeant who measures 8 feet, 3 1/4 inches, is probably the tallest man who served with our troops.
Q. Should evening powders be used? L. E. M.
A. The department of agriculture is not in favor of the use of any pressing powder. It is entirely practicable to put up fruits and vegetables so that they will keep indefinitely by processing the products with heat.
Q. Will you please print the following explanation of the war that the south came to be known as "Dixie"? M. C. Y.
A. A monograph in the London Financial Times on the history of the old Citizens Bank of Louisiana, at New Orleans, reveals the origin of the name "Dixie Land"—the term applied now to all the southern states and preserved in the famous southern war song, "Dixie." Prior to the civil war the Citizens bank, having the power to issue paper notes, issued several millions of bills in denominations of \$10 and \$20, but mostly \$10. The \$10 bills were engraved in French with the French word Dix featured on their backs. The bills became known as "Dixies," and this money became popular. Louisiana was referred to as the "Land of the Dixies" or "Dixie Land." Eventually the term was so broadened as to apply to all the southern states. This seems a very acceptable explanation of the origin of the term, which has been the subject of much discussion.
Q. How many motor cars are registered in New York state? H. W.
A. In 1919 the registrations amount-

ed to 271,622, and it is predicted that 300,000 will be registered before the close of the present year.
Q. What were the 10 largest cities in 1790? W. E. P.
A. New York, Philadelphia, Boston, Baltimore, Providence, R. I., Richmond, Va., Albany, N. Y., Cambridge, Mass., Louisville, Ky. In the order named, were the cities of the day. New York led with a population of 42,401, and Louisville made a small tenth with only 290 inhabitants.
Q. What is the meaning of pour, dix, and talon, as used in pinocchio? W. A. T.
A. In a 48 card pack, the dix (pronounced deuce) is the 3 of trumps, in a 64 card pack, the 7. In two-hand pinocchio, pour is the person not dealing and the talon is the pack of cards remaining after the deal.
Q. Did Theodore Roosevelt have any English ancestors? T. C.
A. An examination of his genealogy shows many Dutch ancestors, some Scotch and Irish, some French Huguenot, but no mention made of any English ones.
Q. What provision has San Francisco made to guard against a fire as one which devastated the city in 1906? R. O. Y.
A. San Francisco has an auxiliary high pressure fire protection system which cost \$2,500,000. It includes a reservoir 760 feet above the level of the harbor with a capacity of 11,000,000 gallons, two pumping stations, and 72 miles of high pressure main. A pressure of 200 pounds is obtained.
Q. Which are the oldest life insurance companies? L. F. D.
A. The oldest existing life insurance companies are the Royal Exchange Assurance corporation and the London Assurance corporation, both of which were chartered in 1720 and began issuing policies in 1721.
Q. What is the death rate for babies in India? O. S.
A. The infant death rate for India is more than twice as high as that of European countries. One child under the age of one year die each year, and at least half of these deaths are preventable. Much effort is being made to help these Indian mothers in the care of children, since most of these deaths can be laid at the door of ignorance and poverty.
Q. Who are Dressers? C. H.
A. Dressers are a people of mixed origin who inhabit a district in Syria. They are descendants of the Semite Mohammedan, but their faith mingles the teachings of the Moslem, Jew, Christian, Gospels, and the Sufi allegories with those of the Koran. They believe in the transmigration of souls with constant advancement and purification. Their teachings enjoin abstinence from wine and tobacco, from profanity and obscenity, and polygamy is unknown among them. There are a few hundred of this sect in the United States.
