CITIZENS ARM AGAINST MOB

(Continued from page 1.)

demolished and damage done to car barns in widely separated sections of the city. The dead: John Blake, union sympathizer, shot and instantly killed. A. G. Smith, Denver, died of bullet wounds.

Two Killed at Burns. While the mob was finishing the job at the Post, another crowd had gathered at the east Denver car barn and a third mob had attacked the south Denver barn, where 150 strikers who had arrived during the day were being housed.

Call for Volunteers. All during the evening mayor Bailey, governor Shoup, chief of police Hamilton Armstrong, who was injured earlier by a brick, and other city officials were in conference at the statehouse considering the advisability of asking for a militia.

Care to Run Again. General manager Hill, of the company, announced early today that he would not be in the city. He declared there were 500 strikers here and more on the way.

Police are holding C. F. McKee, 21 years old, and L. Tarnbaum, 18 years old, who are said to have confessed that they led the mob which tore through the offices of the Denver Post. Plain clothes men said that the youths were heading to a large crowd on a street corner.

Thirty arrests of men alleged to have had a hand in the disturbances had been made up to 2 o'clock this afternoon. One hundred more strikers are expected to arrive here late today. Hundreds of others are on the way. According to Tramway officials.
