## CONGRESSMEN IN SOUTH MAY BE CUT DOWN

Washington, D. C., Sept. 23.—The new census is nearly finished and as a result congress will have to take up the problem of increasing the population basis of representation in the houses of representatives in the house.

Under the present apportionment each house member represents a population of 211,917 people, theoretically. In actual practice each house member now represents a population of 219,904, as there are now 435 members of the house. The present census gives a theoretical United States population of 118,000,000. If the present ratio of representation is maintained, there would be about 540 house members.

It is the problem of congress to allow this increase or to increase the ratio of population to each house member. It is believed from interviews with congressional leaders that the membership will be largely increased. This will be done in spite of arguments by many congressmen that the house membership is now too large for prompt dispatch of the public business.

The membership of the English house of commons is now more than 700 and that parliamentary body is noted as a model for transmission of the British constitution.

States that might suffer a reduction in the number of the house representatives will resist any such reduction and this is the principal reason why in all probability there will be no reduction but an increase in members.

It is probable that the next congress will make an effort to reduce the number of house representatives from the number on the ground that 10,000,000 negroes in the south are disfranchised and therefore are not represented in congress in reality.

The 44th congressional district that was the right to vote of the inhabitants of any state is decided or in any way affected by the house of representatives in the house shall be reduced in the same proportion which the number of disfranchised persons shall bear to the whole number of the citizens of the state. This certainly would give to congress authority to reduce southern representation.

**Southern Control.**  
The membership of the house now includes 118 Republicans, 236 Democrats, 187 Independent Republicans, one Independent, 1 prohibitionist and there are seven vacancies.

The 44th congress, which was Democratic, was dominated by the members from the 16 southern states. There were more than 100 members from the south from the southern states in that congress and they were able to completely dominate the house. It was the same in the senate, where nearly all of the important committee chairmanships were held by senators from the southern states.

In the Democratic caucus, in both house and senate, the southern Democrats were able to control all policies and consequently all legislation, in the house and senate. This gave the men from the south a dominating position in all legislation passed by that congress.

During the 1918 campaign there was considerable dissatisfaction in other sections of the country with the control of congress by southern men and for that reason more than any other, the Republican majority was elected in both house and senate for the 64th congress.

If Gov. Cox wins the presidency in November it is very probable that a Democratic majority will be elected with him for the next congress. 

Hamra was thrown several feet to the ground, causing a severe injury to the head. He was also burned about the body.


