LEAGUE AND IRISH ISSUES COX'S SUBJECT

Providence, R. I., Oct. 20.—Gov. Quinn, of Ohio, today continued his New England campaign with the League of Women Voters as his principal slogan under a hard schedule extending through Rhode Island, Massachusetts and Connecticut.

Following up his attack upon Senator Lodge in Boston last night, the Democratic presidential candidate was prepared today to combat the League's opponents and Republican supporters of Senator Harding, here, where there is a large population of Irish blood, and to other places today, the Irish question was prominent among the governor's subjects.

Insistence on the program included the first of a series of lessons in citizenship. The league constantly disappears ignorance in the matter of voting and through its efforts to enlighten the ignorant voter it often is among the foremost of illiterate classes.

Mrs. G. C. Hanna of Austin, Tex., who is leader of Tuesday afternoon's citizenship class, gave a detailed explanation of the executive, legislative and judicial divisions. She also explained how the powers of these might be changed during times of emergency and gave an example of the power of the president in time of war.

The session was adjourned at 4 o'clock in order that the visitor might obtain passports at the chamber of commerce in preparation for the longer trip to be conducted Wednesday afternoon by Frank Ball. At 5 o'clock Tuesday afternoon a large delegation, leaving the county hall and clinic under the direction of Mrs. Julia A. Sharp.

Education of officers is scheduled for Friday afternoon, the last session of the convention.

Sidelights Around League Convention

MRS. J. C. GRISWOLD told a story to illustrate a point in her talk on Republicanism.

This statement evoked prolonged applause from the delegates.

Mrs. Minnie Fisher Cunningham, of New Jersey, was one of the delegates to the national Democratic convention in San Francisco.

"Don't ask me how they nominate a presidential candidate, for I don't know," she protested, laughingly. "I hope to find out some day, and I'm studying hard, but as far as I could tell from the San Francisco convention, the matter is simply one of the distance. And note! The delegation which makes the most racket is supposed to have the strongest candidate."

Men visitors at the convention invariably comment on their surprise at the kind of delegates they meet. They state that they have, according to popular opinion, come to the "frumps" with flat headed shoes and queer coiffures. And, instead, they are met by girls of youthful and attractive women, gowned in charming fashion, who seem at least to have knowledge about that supposedly impossible combination, beauty and brains.

"The cream of the suffragists of Texas are present at the El Paso convention," said Mrs. O. A. Critchfield, chairman of the local league. "We haven't all of the best, but all we have are the best."

The Women's club will entertain the convention with a musical at 8 o'clock Wednesday night at the clubhouse.

Mrs. Claude de Van Watta, chief of the women's division of the state bureau of labor statistics, is in El Paso for the convention as a delegate and also in the interests of the women and child labor question.
