### Spraying Formula.

EDITOR HERALD:—I see spraying has commenced in earnest, and the poor scale is getting its deserts. I would like to give my way of doing thing, and with good success at all times. First I have a vat any convenient size and a good fire at all times, and do not use brush as that will not do. Put about 30 gallons of water in the vat (20 gallons are not enough); add 20 pounds of sulphur, 10 pounds of lime to water in vat. Make hot as soon as possible. Simply boiling is not enough but for two hours keep the contents of the vat in a live mass of polling lava up to the top of vat so as it will not flow over. At that time it will be nearly black; I then get my keg of sufficient size with 30 pounds of lime in it. Then put one or two bucketsful of warm water into the lime, and add 15 pounds of stock salt while boiling. As soon as the boiling lime in keg is about over I empty all the contents into vat and boil about 30 minutes. Here I wish to say that this is done with exercise of much care and watchfulness and under a cover to the vat. I keep up a continual stirring to prevent the contents from boiling over sides the vat and also from baking on the bottom which it will very quickly do. It is all one man can do to keep things in shape. The above will make sixty gallons of solution which will kill any living insect on a tree for me.
