**FARMER UNEARTHS GIGANTIC JAWBONE**

VENICE, CAL., Jan. 27.—Following the discovery of the jaw bone of a prehistoric animal by J. B. Machado, while digging a well on his ranch east of here, efforts are being made to unearth the remainder of the skeleton, which is believed to be that of a mastodon.

Dr. Charles Bentley, who is considered an authority on biological subjects, estimated that the bone is 15,000 years old at least. It weighs 75 pounds and contains two great teeth, each weighing approximately 15 pounds.

**Pure Food Law Forgotten**

LEGISLATION THAT IT TOOK SEVENTEEN YEARS TO GET NOW A DEAD LETTER. EXPERT BLAMES SECRETARY WILSON.

NEW YORK, Jan. 28.—President Roosevelt's Remsen Commission, which permitted the use of Benzoate of Soda as a food preservative, did a work that "is as alien to scientific truth as it is abhorrent to common sense." Sulphate of copper, aniline dyes, alum, starch, sand and stones have again resumed their pristine place upon the citizen's daily bill-of-fare.

The Pure Food legislation that represented a victory gained only after seventeen years of hard fighting, is now a dead letter, and a goodly portion of the blame lies at the door of Secretary of Agriculture Wilson.

**SAVOY THEATER WILL NOT BE OPENED**

The refusal of the building inspector to approve of the Savoy theatre building in its present shape, prevented the opening of this playhouse.

**Peter Miller--Crook Or Martyr Which?**

Peter Miller--Consummate crook or victim of police vengeance--which?

This stubborn Pennsylvania dutchman, educated in a Berlin university, presents an interesting problem. Convicted of one burglary in Seattle, he is now on trial for a second alleged offense before Judge Easterday. He is held responsible by the Seattle police for a long list of crimes.

"The police had to have somebody to fasten these crimes to. They selected me. They had to make a showing. They bulldozed and beat me until I confessed to a whole list of burglaries. I don't even know what they were. It was to save my life. This is Miller's side of it."

"Miller's arrest was the most important capture in Seattle in years. He was the leader of a gang that had terrorized the city. He has a long criminal record and before this trial is over we will pin the goods on him so that he can do nothing else but give up."

Thus says Captain Tennant, of the Seattle detectives.

What is the truth? Is Miller's defense a pure "frame-up," original in his mind? Captain Tennant says this is the case: "I have never been accused of dishonesty in office or of brutality to my prisoners in eight years of service," he says.

In court Miller glares at Tennant with all the hatred of his nature shining from his eyes. During the recesses, however, Miller chats and smiles with Tennant. Is this just a game, with Miller as the chief actor before a jury whom he hopes will sympathize with him?

Whatever is Miller's guilt, whether the role of martyrdom he is assuming in the face of the great odds against him is real or mere sham, is certain to be revealed before the conclusion of the present trial. But if it isn't, Tennant says he will never give up the fight to disprove the third degree charge made against him.


**MAKE PREPARATIONS FOR INTERNATIONAL FAIR AT SAN FRANCISCO**
