Coach Moyer says Aberdeen is ready to play anybody for the championship.

Classy Featherweight Boxer is Good to the "Old Folks"

Well, that's Johnny Kilbane, the featherweight who gave Abe Attell 10 pounds and fought him to a standstill in Kansas City.

Referee Leo Shea gave Attell the verdict, but the crowd declared it was a draw and a good draw. So did the newspaper men present. Shea, they said, was blinded by the radiance cast by a champion when he lifted Attell's hand after 10 rounds of milling.

Kilbane has been coming for a couple of years and today he is one of the most promising featherweights in the business. Of ideal build, exceptionally clever with both hands and feet and with a wallop in either hand, he is insistent in demanding a return match with Attell, over a longer route.

Kilbane made Attell go after him, refusing to carry the fight to the champion, and he was wise. He boxed with Attell, something few boys can do and break even, but Kilbane was in and out like a flash and although outclassed at infighting, he more than held his own at long range, chance with Attell and should get He appears to have earned another it soon.




