TRIAL MARRIAGES AMONG INDIANS TO BE STOPPED BY THE GOVERNMENT

(By United Press Leased Wire.) PORTLAND, March 23.—Trial marriage among the Klamath Indians must end. The iron hand of civilization demands it and word has come from Washington that the Indians must go through the white man's wedding ceremony. The old tribal marriage ceremony simply calls for a gift of some horses or cattle to the father of the Indian bride. A divorce is arranged by the father returning to his son-in-law the same number of animals given previously for the bride. Recently a number of redskins were legally married. Some of them wanted divorces, and so tore up their marriage certificates, and, believing they were free, began matrimonial life anew with other mates. The United States marshal descended upon them, and 29 Indian bucks and squaws alleged to have used this simple method of divorce are now in Portland awaiting the action of the grand jury.



OLYMPIA, March 23.—Treasurer Lewis has called \$50,000 of state military, capitol and horticultural warrants outstanding.

MOTHER OF MANIAC CARES FOR HIM IN GARRET OF HOME FOR 30 YEARS

CHICAGO, March 23.—Six husky deputies today snared George Odette, raving maniac, through the bars of a steel cage, in the garret of his mother's home near Waukegan today, preparatory to placing him in the Elgin insane asylum. The man had been kept in the cage for nearly thirty years and his commitment to the asylum followed the death of his mother, aged 92, who had remained by his side since she was 62, seldom leaving the garret where she prepared his food, and attempted to lighten the burden of his miserable life. Odette was shocked by a t. e. r. battery and it robbed him of his reason.

FOR BACKYARD FARMERS

"Surface cultivation" concerns everybody who grows anything. It concerns the man with the backyard garden as well as the farmer with the 200-acre field. Surface cultivation is applicable to potatoes and to other garden truck, as well as to corn. Folk used to raise potatoes under straw. Some folk do it yet. And always, other things being normal, the straw-grown potatoes show better yield than potatoes cultivated in the old way. The straw blankets the ground and furnishes an ideal substitute for "dry cultivation." By mulching your potatoes with the dust blanket you can emulate the man who grows big potatoes under straw. DON'T "HILL UP" anything, unless hilling is needed to support weak-stalked plants, or unless the ground is entirely too wet naturally. Hilling merely uncovers damp ground and gives it a chance to dry out. BUT BE SURE THAT THE SEED BED IS MELOW. Then go ahead with your dust blanket.

The time-honored method of cultivating corn or anything else involved a great deal of stirring up of the ground. "Cultivation" was held to be merely a continuation of the process of tilling the soil in the sense of mellowing it. That's what the farmers thought. That's what a good many of their sons think to this very day. And we grow 25 bushels of corn to the acre. Folks have been looking into the record of the old shovel-plow. And the old shovel-plow has been put on the blacklist. For look, see what the old shovel plow does to the corn. It cuts off the slender roots which lie close to the surface of the ground and spread out for several feet about the plant. Corn has no tap root and these lateral roots are its sole source of nourishment. It breaks the ground into clods, thus facilitating evaporation. So today surface cultivation is the thing—a good scratching of the surface. This aims to keep the ground above the plant level and to mulch it with a thin blanket of pulverized dry earth. This blanket of earth serves in a wonderful way to prevent evaporation from the subsoil. It acts just as a dry layer of straw or hay would in keeping the air from the damp soil. SURFACE CULTIVATION, then, is a factor of prime importance in the growing of corn especially. It should begin before the plants come up. If it's a field of corn, the ground should be covered with the harrow or pulverizer while the seed is germinating to prevent the forming of a crust.
