

### Sparks Just Off the Wire

(By United Press Leased Wire.) SAN DIEGO, April 27.—Contrary to previous reports the brigade of marines and bluejackets will not land from the cruisers in the harbor here until some time next week, the date not yet being definitely determined.

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 27.—The senate today confirmed the nomination of William W. Rockhill to be ambassador to Turkey; Curtis J. Gould, jr., of Massachusetts, to be ambassador to Russia; Henry M. Bontell to be minister to Switzerland.

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 27.—The American Federation of Labor is preparing a general appeal for a fund to defend the McNamara's. It expects to raise \$500,000.

CHICAGO, April 27.—Four men in an automobile late yesterday drove up to the jewelry store of Edward Albert & Son, held up the clerks with revolvers and escaped with jewels valued at from \$25,000 to \$50,000.

### Americans Released

(By United Press Leased Wire.) WASHINGTON, April 27.—Reporting to the state department today United States Consul Schmecker at Ensenada, Lower California, telegraphed that the Americans imprisoned at Alamo had been released, and that the insurgents had abandoned Alamo.

### Armistice Must Be Extended

EL PASO, April 27.—Dr. Vasquez Gomez, head of the Mexican revolutionary junta in Washington, will arrive here Saturday and the Diaz envoys from Mexico City on Saturday or Sunday to negotiate for peace. This will necessitate an extension of the armistice. The negotiations probably will be held in Juarez.

### Candidates to Meet In the South End

The South Side voters will hear all candidates who wish to put in an appearance, Friday evening at 8 o'clock, at South Fifty-sixth and L streets. The ninth precinct of the fifth ward in which this hall is located, gave Fawcett the largest proportionate vote in the city. No other precinct, except Fern Hill, showed such Fawcett strength. Four hundred and seventy-one votes registered and 394 were cast. In the three-precincts from which the South Side Improvement club draws its membership, there are over one thousand voters. Candidates may expect to see the largest crowd since the mayoralty campaign was on. One of the best women speakers in Tacoma will be present. Every candidate will be given a chance to have his say.

### Stone-Webster Club Have Big Banquet

The Stone-Webster club of the Northwest, taking in the office men and leaders in the Boston syndicate's various enterprises met 250 strong and banqueted at the Tacoma last night. Officers were chosen for the club with Attorney Hugh A. Tait of Seattle as president. Objective was raised to an attorney because of his conscience, so Dr. A. V. Love took him out and operated on him and brought him back entirely bereft of conscience and gowned in a surplice with the official emblem prominent. ### Beats "Typhoid Mary"

HONOLULU, April 27.—Discounting even the case of "Typhoid Mary," the New York woman who has been in quarantine for years because she spreads that disease, Hulu, a physically perfect young Hawaiian is in close detention here today as a "cholera carrier" and is believed to be partly responsible for the epidemic which is just being stamped out in Honolulu. Every day, the physicians who are fighting the cholera say, Hulu's body breeds millions of the cholera bacilli.

### STEEL TRUST TO BE PROBED

CLEVELAND, O., April 27.—The foundation for a government investigation of the United States Steel Corporation is expected to result this afternoon from the grand jury's action in probing alleged rebating by Ohio railroads. It is understood that indictments will be returned against one of the most prominent railroad men in the country as well as numerous minor steel and railroad officials.

### MRS. MORSE MAKES APPEAL TO TAFT

C., April 27.—A personal appeal to President Taft for information as to the status of the petition for her husband's pardon has been made by Mrs. Charles W. Morse, wife of the New York banker, now in Atlanta prison. Mrs. Morse was informed that the president would make an announcement of the case within a few days.

### PORTLAND LABOR TO RAISE FUND

PORTLAND, April 27.—When the Central Labor council of Portland meets Friday night, labor leaders expect that the first step toward raising funds locally for the defense of John B. McNamara, alleged dynamiter, will be taken. It is known that the matter will be discussed, and it is believed probable that each union man will be assessed a small sum, or possibly a mass meeting may be called and the general public interested.

### Rabid Child Bites Mother

J., is in the Pasteur Institute here, while physicians are doing all in their power to save her from a horrible death. When a mad dog bit a dozen children in North Bergen last January little Susie Mandoline was the first to show the effects.
